The St. Augustine Wild Reserve is home to over 30 large and small cats. Other species housed at the Reserve include wolves, African crested porcupine, spotted hyenas, white-tailed deer and a host of birds from ducks and geese to Royal Palm Turkeys, macaws and fancy chickens. We have a very rare golden tabby tiger named Sitarra which means "Star of India", one of only 30 in the world!



Founded by Deborah Warrick, Carnivore Biologist, the Reserve was developed in 1981 as a 501(c)3 non-profit corporation to provide a home for unwanted exotic animals that would otherwise be euthanized. Most of the animals were raised for the entertainment industry or as pets.



The Reserve assists both the U.S.D.A. and the Florida Fish and Wildlife in providing a home for animals seized from illegal situations. These animals are given the chance to live out their lives being well care for and maintained by a host of volunteers.



The Living History Park was the site of the former water-works department and had been overgrown and neglected for years. Donated materials and labor, grants, and a great deal of love, attention, and effort have turned this eyesore into an attraction for visitors in a tranquil setting complete with a natural spring. 

Located on Sandy Hook, NJ where direct access to ocean, estuarine and barrier beach environments are all possible in one visit, NJS GC offers homeschool groups the opportunity to explore key coastal habitats and core science concepts through "hands-on," inquiry-based learning experiences. Our full day, guided field trip programs are suitable for all grade levels and can accommodate small and large groups. Each program is interdisciplinary, supports STEM, history and social science literacy, and is correlated to state and national curriculum content standards.

Field trip activities include using a seine net to observe fish and other marine life or deploying a plankton net to collect microscopic organisms. Shovels and sieves are used to uncover bottom dwelling animals from the sediments of Sandy Hook Bay. For those Homeschool families unfamiliar with the Home Textile Tool Museum (HTTM), it is located in Bradford County, Pennsylvania, in the beautiful hilltop village of Orwell. In 1999, a small group founded HTTM to preserve the tools and the heritage of textile production in American homes in the early 1800s. The museum offers informative displays, demonstrations, and workshops on textile related subjects. Come visit and help us celebrate the Museum's 20th Anniversary.

For 2019 we are planning several demonstrations on Saturdays that everyone will enjoy. These include Blacksmithing, Cordage, Drop Spindle Spinning, Flax Processing, Knitting, Sheep Shearing, and Weaving on looms of all sizes.

Saturday events will begin on May 18 with an array of demonstrations following the journey from making the wheels and looms, to spinning yarn, dyeing wool and weaving cloth. Flax processing from plant to thread will also be demonstrated.

Other special days continue our theme. Guild members will demonstrate bobbin lace and embroidery techniques. Antique tape looms keep hands busy on another Saturday. Enthusiasts will demonstrate early crank and treadle sewing machines.




