

NORTH EAST, Md. – Founded in 1968 to meet the postsecondary and continuing education needs of Cecil County residents, Cecil College has been serving the community and shaping its future for more than 50 years. With a diverse student population, Cecil College enrolls 3,000 credit students and more than 3,500 non-credit students annually. Cecil offers associate degrees, certificate programs, and non-credit classes.

Classes, taught by qualified faculty, can be taken in a traditional classroom setting with some being offered online. Many of the programs can transfer to four-year institutions. The College offers a full range of day and evening classes along with a new fully online General Studies degree.

Cecil offers a variety of associate degrees and certificate programs. The college has formalized articulation agreements with public and private four-year institutions throughout Maryland and the United States to expedite the transfer process for Cecil students and graduates. Cecil College has 2+2 partnerships with Wilmington University and University of Maryland University College. Students can complete a bachelor's degree in materials engineering from Frostburg State University or a bachelor's degree in social work from Salisbury University without leaving Cecil County.

Students can also opt to take non-credit courses to upgrade their job skills or expand their horizons. Certifications are available for various healthcare careers. Additionally, students can earn computer certifications in several areas as well as business and management training certificates.

Cecil College is a member of the Maryland Junior College Athletic Conference in all sports and competes in the National Junior College Athletic Association. The college fields men's teams in baseball, basketball, cross country, and soccer; and women's teams in basketball, softball, soccer, cross country, and volleyball. The athletic programs have won numerous titles, including the 2019 NJCAA Region XX men's basketball championship.

Dual Enrollment at Montgomery College

Nathan Villiger had no trouble learning most of the subject matter in his home-school curriculum, but he was not confident about his ability to teach himself math. The 17-year-old senior from Gaithersburg enrolled in precalculus and a political science class at the College’s Germantown Campus—and thrived. “The first two weeks were definitely an adjustment period,” he says, “but in the end I learned a lot. I think it was a great first exposure to college-level work.”

If you are interested in getting a head start on your college career, then Dual Enrollment may be for you.

Dual Enrollment is an MC academic initiative that allows qualified high school students to be admitted and enrolled at Montgomery College to take credit courses while still completing their high school diploma requirements.

Students enroll in a variety of courses at the college and the credits earned may be applied to a degree program at MC or may potentially be transferred to another institution.

Students can attend Montgomery College courses on campus or online. Need-based financial assistance is also available.

Villiger is enrolled in a calculus class this semester while he waits to hear from four-year schools, including St. Mary’s College of Maryland, Dickinson, Gettysburg, Swarthmore, and Haverford. He recommends all home-schooled students take courses at Montgomery College.



“When you’ve been used to flexible deadlines as a home-schooler, you learn quickly about deadlines and due dates in MC classes,” he says. “And MC has more resources—like the math learning center [MAPEL Center]—to help you succeed.”





Founded in 1840, St. Mary's College offers an undergraduate liberal arts and sciences education and small-college experience like those found at exceptional private colleges. St. Mary's College shares the hallmarks of private institutions: an outstanding faculty, talented students, high academic standards, a challenging LEAD curriculum, a sense of community, and a spirit of intellectual inquiry. 





CENTRAL PENN COLLEGE LAUNCHES THE FIRST FREE HOUSING INITIATIVE IN CAPITAL REGION

Central Penn College—under the direction of President Linda Fedrizzi-Williams—has been working to address the global college affordability issue that many students and families face.

“We are proud to be the first college in central Pennsylvania to offer free housing to all incoming new students,” said Dr. Fedrizzi-Williams. “With this initiative, all incoming freshmen and transfer students—who choose to live on campus—will be eligible to receive free housing for the entire 2020–2021 academic year.” This is the second year for the initiative to be in effect.

This equates to a savings of up to **\$5,800**, for students who start in the summer term and go continuously through the spring of 2021. For students who start in the fall term, this equates to a savings of up to \$4,350.

In addition to offering free housing, the college has made the decision to **freeze tuition rates** for the 2020–2021 academic year.

Central Penn College is located in Summerdale, PA, which is about seven miles north of Harrisburg. Founded in 1881, the college has been a leader in providing a career-focused education to students in central Pennsylvania and beyond.

Free Housing – How It Works

To be eligible for free housing, students must...

- Attend full-time
- Be in good academic and financial standing
- Avoid any disciplinary issues

Qualified students will still be responsible for paying their tuition, utilities and a meal plan.

“A college education is an opportunity to improve one’s life for the better, and we want to provide that opportunity to more students,” said President Fedrizzi-Williams.

Central Penn College’s academic schedule operates on 11-week terms offered four times a year. The Free Housing Initiative for the 2020–2021 academic year starts in the summer term, which begins in July 2020, and runs through the spring term, which ends in June 2021.
