

When Nicholas Natale finished high school in 2011, he received two diplomas in two months. Earlier that spring, Natale earned his associate degree from Montgomery County Community College in Liberal Studies and enrolled in Harrisburg University as a rising junior, all before graduating high school.





Nathan Villiger had no trouble learning most of the subject matter in his home-school curriculum, but he was not confident about his ability to teach himself math. The 17-year-old senior from Gaithersburg enrolled in precalculus and a

political science class at the College's Germantown Campus—and thrived. “The first two weeks were definitely an adjustment period,” he says, “but in the end I learned a lot. I think it was a great first exposure to college-level work.”

If you are interested in getting a head start on your college career, then Dual Enrollment may be for you.

Dual Enrollment is an MC academic initiative that allows qualified high school students to be admitted and enrolled at Montgomery College to take credit courses while still completing their high school diploma requirements.

Students enroll in a variety of courses at the college and the credits earned may be applied to a degree program at MC or may potentially be transferred to another institution.

Students can attend Montgomery College courses on campus or online. Need-based financial assistance is also available.

Villiger is enrolled in a calculus class this semester while he waits to hear from four-year schools, including St. Mary's College of Maryland, Dickinson, Gettysburg, Swarthmore, and Haverford. He recommends all home-schooled students take courses at Montgomery College. “When



you've been used to flexible deadlines as a home-schooler, you learn quickly about deadlines and due dates in MC classes,” he says. “And MC has more resources—like the math learning center [MAPEL Center]—to help you succeed.”

How Walsh University Harnessed Collaboration, Agility in Response to COVID-19

It's a label that has been hard to change. For decades, most conventional higher education institutions have been characterized as operating at a 19th century pace in a 21st century economy. More than any other time in history, universities have been struggling to adapt to an ever-evolving landscape that now includes digital course offerings, accelerated student expectations and a constantly shifting marketplace.

Goal posts and a Cavalier-logo turf field also capped off the Larry Staudt Field, a new addition to Walsh's state-of-the-art athletic complex that will serve as the home field for Walsh's soccer, lacrosse and football teams.

For an industry historically slow to change, Walsh University is modeling the agility and flexibility necessary to remain relevant while meeting the needs of students who expect immediate results and a marketplace that demands them.



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

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
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
